Abstract: Within the field of French literature worldwide, the literature of Quebec is built as a privileged means for defining the quest of identity and survival in a hostile space/environment as a result of the Anglophone menace and conservatism. The author Anne Hebert illustrates the drama of the people of Quebec in a literary work that facilitates the characters' escape, always in search of the absolute as a variant of their identity. It is through dream that this escape becomes possible, and the novels Les Chambres de bois et Kamouraska explore it in terms of a sort of premonitory experience as well as a profound descent into the depths of the self in order to assemble the fragments of being.
